Dear Jack:

At a meeting of the Vermont Environmental Board on October 27, 1971, the members voted unanimously to deny your request for a ruling allowing continuance of construction of two single family resident dwellings to be used as model homes on the so-called Village on the Green tract of land in Stowe.

The Board's official position was recorded as follows:

"The Environmental Board unanimously denies the request of Land/Tech Corporation for continuance of the construction of two model homes on Land/Tech's land in Stowe on the grounds that the two parcels in question are located in a proposed development, an application for which is currently pending before the District Environmental Commission #5 pursuant to 10 VSA Chapter 151, and that the two parcels in question are in fact owned or controlled by Land/Tech Corporation. The Board further rules that even if the application pending before the District Commission were amended to exclude said parcels, a permit under 10 VSA Chapter 151 will still be required in that the development will be on a tract or tracts of land, owned or controlled by a person, including more than ten acres of land within a radius of five miles of any point on any involved land, for commercial or industrial purposes."
